Fall Mare Checks

This is also a good time to discuss nutrition and is a safe time to do dentistry. Remember... Your mare needs her Rhino (Pneumabort-K) vaccinations at 3, 5, 7 and 9 months of pregnancy. These vaccines will help prevent abortion in your mare.
